Executive Summary

2022 was a good consolidation year for the Club, after the interruptions of COVID in 2020 and 2021. The Club was able to complete a full winter season and at the time of writing, is participating in summer season.

Unfortunately, winter season this year was affected by the La Nina weather system and several rounds were cancelled or impacted by rain. Heavily affected were our grass court teams, the Modified NetSetGo Goannas and Kangaroos, and as a response, the Club refunded the SHLNC registration fee for these players at the end of winter 2022.

Overall, Winter 2022 saw the Club somewhat decline in comparison to 2021 registrations:

2021:

Total registrations: 271 players

Total teams: 31 teams

We are uncertain what affected our registration numbers this year but anecdotally, other clubs seemed to struggle to reach their pre-COVD registration levels too.

Disappointingly, we had no Mini Magpies this year which has a bearing on our NSG and junior teams in the future. It is a club priority to push for these players in 2023.

So much effort goes into every week and to make it through to the Grand Final, and then win, is a fantastic achievement. The teams should be very proud of themselves, as we are of them!

We had runners up in: Cadet 1 Possums, Cadet 2 Wagtails, Senior B3 Bullants and 9 out of an eligible 23 teams played in Finals.

The club would like to thank all the people that contribute to keeping the club ticking, many of whom are mentioned in this report. The club would also like to acknowledge & thank all parents and guardians who encourage, support and deliver players to training and competition. Seeing everyone learn new skills, be active, develop new friendships and have fun is what it is all about.

Registrations

Registrations this year were completed using a new portal, Play HQ, as MyNetball was discontinued as a directive from NetballNSW. The portal had some issues, many of which came from the inexperience of IWNA, and the clubs, in using it effectively. We hope by winter 2023 many of these issues will be ironed out.

This year we registered 232 players.


18 players NSG (2 teams)109 players Junior (12 teams, two in each age group)27 players Cadets (3 teams)78 players Seniors (8 teams)

Our overall numbers are a decrease from 271 in 2021. Unfortunately, there was a decrease in our numbers at:

- the entry level age groups (Minis)
- Modified NetSetGo
- 13s and 14s in Juniors
- 1 senior team

With these 232 players we formed a total of 25 teams, which is down from 31 teams last year. We decreased our team numbers in all areas except Cadets, where we increased by one team.

In our junior teams we saw two teams entered into each age group, often in a high and low division. This is an issue for the Club and its players, without a range of options in each age group/division.



In 2023, the Club must strive to increase minis teams, hold on to junior players and ensure diversity of teams to be a Club who caters to all age and stage players.

Our club was again a registered provider for the NSW Government Active Kids Program. The program allows a \$100 voucher to be used to subsidise the cost of registration fees for players between the ages of 4 ½ and 18 who are enrolled in school. The large majority of eligible playersused the rebate to contribute to their registration fees this year.

The club thanks Julie McBride for fulfilling our registrar role in 2022, and for her tireless efforts especially in Jan-Feb when registrations, grading and team collation is a chaotic business!

Grading

The club would like to extend our thanks and appreciation to Jacinta Fletcher, Cassie Robinson and Liz Leonard for their assistance in administering the grading process this year.

As per club policy, teams are graded in age groups from competition age (10) where there are multiple teams in the age group. The purpose of grading is to ensure that the players with the rightfit of age and skill are placed in the correct divisions to get the most out of their netball throughoutthe season.

This year we graded teams in the 10s, 11s, 12s, 13s, 14s, 15s and cadets and formed 15 teams. That is a decrease of 6 (21 teams in 2021).

The success of our grading program over the last 3 years has enabled us to enter division 1 teams in the 11, 12, 14 15 and cadet age groups in 2022.

As last year we are still looking to grow our numbers in our junior teams to address the lack of breadth across age groups. In some age groups there is a large gap between divisions in which we have teams. As stated previously our goal is to grow player numbers particularly in the younger agegroups to help address this issue.

Secretary

Court bookings

The booking process went smoothly, we completed our EOI and (as usual) were granted the courts that we asked for. We decided to stick with the older courts as there are only three new courts (we require 4) and the toilets are across the canal from the new courts.

A code to turn on the lights is given to 3 people from the club, currently Gemma, Liz and Alicia.

Council communications

Our council contact is Heather Palmisani. She is the point of contact for court bookings and any other issues (eg lights).

Photos

For the first time in 3 years, we managed to have netball photos! The rain held off and we took photos at the Courts.- thanks to our photographer Charlie and the managers for corralling their teams.

Coaching

This year saw a continuation of our coaching processes:

1. The Netball Coach Subscriptions

We renewed our subscription for 'The Netball Coach' this year. This is a fantastic resource for our coaches. There is a huge number and variety of drills, suitable for netballers of all levels, from beginner to elite. Coaches are also able to create session plans and share them amongst each other if you're coaching together or if another coach is filling in for you at training. Each drill has a comprehensive video showing how the drill works and with the coaching breaking down the steps and explaining key coaching points. This is an exciting investment in our Lakers coaches.

2. Coaching courses

It is a compulsory requirement for all new coaches to attend the IWSNA practical coaching course.

This year we had 22 coaches across our 17 junior teams. Our coaches are a group made up of parents and players.

Umpiring

In 2022 Lakers had a **cohort of 27 umpires** who umpired regularly. Of these, **19** were experienced umpires, accredited before the 2022 season. There were **8 trainee umpires in 2022**, with most umpires commencing training for the first time. All trainee umpires attended an Introduction to Umpiring Course conducted by Inner West Netball Association, before commencing courtside training. The course was facilitated by Club National umpires from within the Association. All umpires successfully completed the Rules of Netball Exam, prior to gaining accreditation.

Training and accreditation of trainee and badged umpires continued during the season, resulting in 6 umpires gaining a Club Badge and 4 umpires gaining Association Badge accreditation.

Lakers also continued ongoing umpire training for many of the accredited umpires. These umpires received training from National umpires - on higher age groups and divisions. This allowed for ongoing development and support within the Club Umpiring Development Scheme. Unfortunately, no umpires were trained for National badging this year, due to a time clash between National umpire availability and playing times. Several umpires were identified for National training and accreditation in 2023.

Uniforms and Merchandise

This year saw the changeover to purchasing uniforms from Player HQ. This came with a few obstacles as families worked out how to navigate the system. The system is clunky, but our only option at this point. With this in mind, the club has explored the option of moving to a separate online merchandising provider. This would mean that all uniform sales would be handled by a separate company and mailed to families. No more picking up from front verandas! Club members will need to be well-informed of the shift as it will mean ordering can only be done at the start of the season as the uniforms are made to order.

The club is also considering introducing a new line of merchandise that includes a singlet and short model. This is consistent with being an inclusive club. The design and production is still in progress.

There is still considerable stock with the dress and the shorts.

There is limited stock of visors and caps, although these are not heavily sought after items.

There is old stock of hoodies with an incorrect colour logo that we may want to give away. The newer hoodies are in shorter supply in the larger sizes. The sizings on these were extremely small.

Jillian will return all the stock to the storage shed. The goal is for the online uniform platform to be operational for 2023.

We acknowledge & thank Jillian Wolfe for all her efforts as uniform coordinator in 2022. Jillian is leaving the role this year; she will be missed.

Equipment

This year each team was provided with the following:

- 1. Coaches bag; sports bag for game ball and any other necessary equipment
- 2. Training kit; net bags with balls and other training equipment such as ladders, cones etc
- 3. Managers kit: backpack with game bibs, player folders, first aid kits

For 2023, there's enough equipment to accommodate 25 teams, only purchasing a training ball each. We expect an order of SHLNC branded game balls in Nov 2022.

We have continued with a rented storage facility to keep the equipment and we keep an inventorythat is managed by the equipment officer.

The club extends its thanks to Alison Sayer for all her efforts with the club, over an extensive time period and now that she is leaving the role for 2023, know she will be missed! She has offered to help the next Co-ordinator in any way

Communications

Throughout 2022 we have continued to use MailChimp email and Facebook as our primary communication tools. We also use Instagram and Twitter to increase our reach.

This year a new website was developed, as we lost the previous platform with the demise of MyNetball. The new website is hosted by Wix.com and sits on our domain, shlnc.com.au.
